While nothing can replace the "Christmas chapters" in Matthew and Luke as the best source of information about God sending His Son to be our Savior, the library has a number of children's resources available to supplement your Christmas reading and viewing.

# Dispensation #7 Kingdom

Each Dispensation has progressively provided an easier resource for man to use in fulfilling God's purpose. What could make man's job easier than grace? How about the visible presence of the King, Jesus Christ? This is exactly what will be provided in the last dispensation of human history. Jesus Christ will physically return to the earth and rule as King from Jerusalem.

It will be a spectacular event when Jesus returns to initiate this new dispensation. Psalm 2 describes this event in some general terms. In verse 1, the heathen rage and the people imagine a vain thing. In Verses 2 and 3, the vain thing they imagine is that they can successfully set themselves against the LORD and His Anointed (Christ), and that they can break the bands of sovereignty to free themselves from accountability to God. In verses 4-12, God sets His Son upon the holy hill of Zion and the Son possesses the uttermost part of the earth, ruling with a rod of iron.

Matthew 25 describes the judgments of Israel and the nations to set things right in the beginning of the Kingdom, and the prophets of the Old Testament give us glimpses of what life will be like during that reign. Revelation chapters 20 and 21 tell us some significant things about this dispensation as well. For example, it will last for exactly 1,000 years (Revelation 20:2-7). [Hence, we call it the Millennial Kingdom.] Also, Revelation chapter 21 describes the New Jerusalem where resurrected saints will live.

So what is the Kingdom Dispensation all about and why is it the last one?

#### The Resource

The resource, as stated already, is the person of Jesus Christ Himself, and His perpetual personal presence on earth. Zechariah 9:9 identifies Christ as the King in His first coming, Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion; shout, O daughter of Jerusalem: behold, thy King cometh unto thee: he is just, and having salvation; lowly and riding upon an ass, and upon a colt the foal of an ass. It would have been an acceptable thing unto the LORD if Israel had recognized this at the time, but the Kingship of Jesus

became an obstacle to the Jews when He was on earth. In Mark chapter 15, this controversy is evident in the trial and crucifixion of Christ. In verse 2, Pilate asked Him, Art thou the King of the Jews? In verse 9, Pilate offered to release to the people the King of the Jews. In verse 12, when they refused Him, Pilate asked the multitude, What will ye then that I shall do unto him whom ye call the King of the Jews? In verse 18, the Roman soldiers hailed Christ as the King of the Jews. In verse 26, Pilate had inscribed on the top of His cross THE KING OF THE JEWS. And in verse 32, the chief priests of Israel mocked Jesus by crying out, Let Christ the King of Israel descend now from the cross that we may see and believe. If only they would have believed! They missed the marvelous truth of the King who shall reign over Israel and the world in the Millennial Kingdom and in all eternity future.

He will indeed come and He will indeed reign. Zechariah 9:10 places Christ on the throne in the Millennium, And I will cut off the chariot from Ephraim. and the horse from Jerusalem, and the battle bow shall be cut off: and he shall speak peace unto the heathen: and his dominion shall be from sea even to sea, and from the river even to the ends of the earth. Revelation 19:11-21 describes His glorious descent from Heaven and His magnificent triumph over Satan, the Anti-Christ, and the False Prophet. The Anti-Christ and the False Prophet will be cast into the lake of fire, but Satan will be chained in a bottomless pit. Then Revelation 20:4-6 describes how He will resurrect the saints of Israel's past and of the Tribulation period and reign with them for 1,000 years. Zechariah 14:9 states it definitively, and the LORD shall be king over all the earth: in that day shall there be one LORD, and his name one.

#### The Responsibility

The responsibility will be a simple one: go up to Jerusalem and worship the King. Zechariah 14:16 says, And it shall come to pass that every one that is left of all the nations which came against Jerusalem shall even go up from year to year to worship the King, the LORD of hosts, and to keep the feast of tabernacles.

It will be a marvelously tranquil time in the Millennium. Satan will be bound and prevented from any activity (Revelation 20:1-3). Thorns and briers will disappear (Isaiah 55:13; Isaiah 35:1-2). Animals will become non-violent and non-predatory (Isaiah 65:25; Isaiah 11:6). Physical health will dominate (Isaiah

33:24; Isaiah 35:5-6). There will be increased longevity (Isaiah 65:20). Conditions will be right for high productivity (Isaiah 30:26; Isaiah 41:18; Ezekiel 34:26-27). There will be a perpetual growing season (Amos 9:13). There will be an abundance of food (Isaiah 30:23-24; Isaiah 32:15; Joel 2:24). There will be no discrimination (Zechariah 8:23; Isaiah 14:1-2; Isaiah 61:5). There will be no oppression (Isaiah 14:3-6). There will be no fear in travel (Isaiah 19:23-25; Isaiah 35:8-10).

In this amazing environment, there will be an absolute unity in worship (Isaiah 45:23; Isaiah 66:23; Jeremiah 3:17; Malachi 1:11). A universal language will prevail which will serve to enrich this unity (Zephaniah 3:9).

#### The Failure

In spite of the visible presence of Christ, some will still fail to respond by faith. There will be some who will be dealt with for their failure to worship Christ (Zechariah 14:17-19). But inevitably, there will be many who conform outwardly to the requirement but inwardly remain rebellious.

This will be evidenced at the end of the millennium when Satan is loosed from his prison. According to Revelation 20:7-10, Satan will be able to amass a huge rebellion against Christ from the nations which are in the four quarters of the earth. He will gather them together to battle and the number will be as the sand of the sea.

One may wonder how this could happen when Satan is not around to bear influence for 1000 years and Christ is visibly present on earth reigning in righteousness. But the point will finally and emphatically be made that depraved human nature is determined to act like foolish sheep, going astray, each one turning to his own way (Isaiah 53:6). And without faith, it is impossible to please God (Hebrews 11:6).

#### The Judgment

There will be a continual judging of rebellious citizens of the Kingdom throughout the Millennium. There will be quick and decisive judgment against all wrong doers (Revelation 12:5; Psalm 72:4-14). Nations will be punished for failing to comply with Christ's law (Zechariah 14:17-19). The death penalty will be enforced (Isaiah 11:4; Jeremiah 31:30).

Then, at the end of the Millennium, there will

be a battle of sorts with a quick and decisive ending. Satan will gather a large rebellion against Christ and the saints. Christ will easily win, Satan will be cast into the lake of fire, and fire from heaven will come down and consume all the rebellious men (Revelation 20:7-10).

This will be followed immediately by the great white throne judgment. The unsaved of all time will be judged and found guilty and condemned to an eternity of punishment in the lake of fire (Revelation 20:11-15). This will be the final judgment.

#### The Remnant

God had promised Abraham that his seed would possess a land forever. Genesis 17:8 says, And I will give unto thee, and to thy seed after thee, the land wherein thou art a stranger, all the land of Canaan, for an everlasting possession; and I will be their God. In the prophetic context of Ezekiel 37:24-28, this promise is reinforced. Verse 25 says, And they shall dwell in the land that I have given unto Jacob my servant, wherein your fathers have dwelt; and they shall dwell therein, even they, and their children, and their children's children for ever: and my servant David shall be their prince for ever.

It is clear from this language that the future dwelling place for the descendants of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob will be the exact same geographical location that was originally granted to these patriarchs. It also appears from this, that after the great white throne judgment real human beings will continue to live on the earth. The human body created for Adam in the garden of Eden was perfectly suited for an eternal existence in the earth environment. Sin prevented that from taking place. But once sin is finally dealt with and eliminated as a factor in human life, it is perfectly reasonable to believe that there are happy prospects for human life on earth in eternity future and that God's promises will be literally fulfilled.

#### Conclusion

In eternity future Israel will be a physical nation on a physical earth inhabited by real human beings. The church, consisting entirely of glorified human beings, will be the bride of Christ, ruling and reigning with Him.

What happens next? About that, we are given absolutely no information in the Bible. But it will have to be wonderful. There will be no sin. There will be only believing, faithful creatures. There will be the

perpetual presence of the glory of God. It will be eternal life to the fullest!

# The Dispensational Concept of Fulfilling the Purpose of God

God's purpose for man is simply stated as this: man is to reflect the image of God as he manages God's property (Genesis 1:26). In each Dispensation, God provided a resource that would assist man in reflecting His image.

**Innocence**, a state of being without contact, exposure or experience with sin.

**Conscience**, an innate perception of the difference between what is morally good and what is morally bad according to the dictates of God, even without a knowledge of God's written law.

**Government**, the right of one man to tell another person what to do (or not to do) with the authority to enforce compliance, with the intention that such government will enforce God's law.

**Promise**, God's declaration, written or verbal, concerning which He intends to do.

**Law**, an explicit statement concerning what God considered to be right and wrong.

**Grace**, the enabling grace of the Holy Spirit which He bestows upon all believers as He indwells them.

Kingdom, the personal Kingship of Christ.

Each resource was also designed to assist man in choosing right over wrong because choosing right over wrong is equivalent to reflecting the image of God. Of course, you have to know the difference in order to make the right choice (Isaiah 7:16; Isaiah 5:20).

**Innocence** was the ability to choose right over wrong because right is all you know. It was the familiar in contrast to the strange. (This also characterizes the simplicity one ultimately obtains in Christ resulting from a child-like faith.)

**Conscience** is the ability to choose right over wrong based upon an internal understanding of the difference between the two.

**Government** is the authority of some to enforce right over wrong in others.

**Promise** is an incentive to choose right over wrong because of the blessing that will result from doing so.

**Law** is a written explanation in detail of what God considers to be right and wrong.

**Grace** is an enabling to do the right thing by the direct involvement of the Holy Spirit.

**Kingdom** is the incentive to choose right over wrong because of the personal reign of the righteous King, Jesus Christ, who will immediately and decisively judge all wrong doing.

### Why Choosing Wrong Over Right is the Opposite of Reflecting the Image of God

Reflecting the image of God requires a position of dominion. It cannot be done in a position of submission. According to Genesis 1:26, God's plan was to make man in His own image and likeness and in that image and likeness man was to have dominion over the earth. Thus, dominion was directly linked to the concept of bearing the image and likeness of God.

On the other hand, choosing wrong over right is an act of submission to an authority other than God. In Genesis 3:1-6, a creature was able to beguile Eve and knowingly convince Adam to doubt God's Word. Adam and Eve then relinquished their dominion and voluntarily submitted to the authority of the Serpent.

Choosing wrong over right places men in bondage. For example, Adam and Eve's choice placed them in bondage to fear (Genesis 3:7-8). Cain's choice placed him in bondage to being a fugitive (Genesis 4:12). Men's choices before the flood placed them in bondage to evil imaginations (Genesis 6:12). Israel's choices placed them in bondage in Egypt (Exodus 6:5). And on and on goes the scenario. Ultimately, the choices of mankind place them in bondage to the fear of death (Hebrews 2:14-15).

When a person makes a choice, it appears that he is in control, but when he chooses wrong, he is relinquishing control and submitting to the authority of sin and to the authority of the prince of sin. Jesus

explained in John 8:44 that the children of the Devil are not really doing their own devices, they are really doing the devices of the Devil. Ephesians 2:2-3 explains that those who are dead in their trespasses and sins are entrapped in the course of this world and compelled to follow the prince of the power of the air and the lusts of the flesh. They are in bondage to these things, not in control of them.

Man cannot reflect the image of God when he is submitted to an authority other than God. God Himself never submits to any authority other than Himself. I am the LORD: that is my name: and my glory will I not give to another, neither my praise to graven images (Isaiah 42:8). If a man is going to reflect the image of God, then he cannot be submitted to any authority other that God. To do so is to deny the absolute glory of God.

### Why Choosing Right Over Wrong is Equivalent to Reflecting the Image of God

God is absolutely right about everything (Deuteronomy 32:4b; Psalm 92:15; Psalm 145:17*a*). Therefore, to do right is to reflect God (1 Peter 1:16; Colossians 3:10). To choose right is to reject any authority other than God (Romans 6:16-17).

To be right is to be in a position of authority, control, and dominion. God is right and He is thus the Judge (Psalm 50:6). Those who are right in God, will judge with Him (1 Corinthians 6:2).

#### Why Faith is the Key

Believing God to the point of excluding everything else provides the standard by which everything can be measured as to whether it is right or wrong. It is imperative for man to believe that it is impossible for God to lie (Hebrews 6:18; Numbers This was the problem that Adam confronted.He failed to believe that it was impossible for God to lie and therefore he disbelieved what God said. 1 Timothy 6:3-5 defines the principle that if anyone consents not to the wholesome words of Jesus Christ, he knows nothing. The ignorance of unbelief always leads to choosing wrong over right. On the other hand, if Adam had believed that what God said was right, then Adam would have made the right choice and not submitted to another authority. It all boiled down to this simple factor: would Adam believe God or not.

Believing God to the point of excluding everything else is necessary to bring an unsaved

person into fellowship with God. First he must believe that God is right when He says all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God (Romans 3:23). Next, he must believe that God is right when He says that the wages of sin is death (Romans 6:23). Then, he must believe that God is right when He says that His Son, Jesus Christ, satisfied the sin problem (Romans 3:24-26). And finally, he must believe that God is right when He says that faith in Jesus Christ is the only way a person can be saved from his sins (Acts 16:31;1John 5:12) and be brought into fellowship with God the Father (Romans 5:1-2; Ephesians 2:8; Hebrews 10:19). When an unsaved person believes these things in his heart and professes them unto God with his mouth, he is brought into the fellowship of the Body of Christ where he obtains the capacity to reflect the glory of God (Romans 10:9-10; Ephesians 1:3-14).

Believing God to the point of excluding everything else is the necessary factor in making all the resources useful in choosing right over wrong. By believing God, my conscience directs me to do right. Otherwise, it will follow a different standard. If Government believes God, it will enforce God's Word. Otherwise, it will make laws based on a different standard. If I believe God, I will wait as long as it takes for Him to fulfill His promises. Otherwise, I will seek welfare from other sources. If I believe God, I will study His Law and follow it. Otherwise, I will ignore it. If I believe God, I will make use of His enabling grace. Otherwise, I will never realize its value. The bottom line is this: I must believe.

#### Conclusion


Do you believe that God is right? Do you believe it to the point that you reject every other source of authority in your life?

Do you believe the Word of God? Do you use it to measure everything you do and to guide you in all your choices?

Are you reflecting the image of God? Are you freely doing what is right, cultivating to prosperity each realm of your life, and not living in bondage to any authority other than God?

If you have been born again, you have a conscience, an accountability to authority, a copy of God's written Word which includes both His promises and His Law, and you have the enabling grace of the indwelling Holy Spirit. All of these things work effectively when activated by faith and assist us in fulfilling God's prevailing purpose for us: that we reflect His glory as we live here on earth. This is the dispensational teaching of the Bible.

We are very busily working through our furlough. We moved in late August into the house my brother's church is letting us live in for the year. The children entered into the Christian school here and have enjoyed that.

The process of setting up all the meetings with churches that we will visit for the year takes time. We prepared 100 information packets about our work and ourselves and sent them to 100 new churches. Calling all those churches to try to schedule meetings for us to visit them takes 3-4 hours every day for several weeks to get hold of all the pastors. Usually, after all that work, we will get 10-20 new meetings in those churches. Then, we call and schedule meetings in all of our supporting churches. Again, that takes 3-4 hours a day for a few weeks. In the middle of all that, we visit some supporting churches to give reports on Sundays.

We are praying now about all the expenses of living in the States. We are still paying our full rent and the bills on our home in Hong Kong. A new family will move in there in December and pay half the rent and the bills for six months. But, there seem to be a lot of one-time expenses hitting us right now. The car that a friend lent us for the year needs four new tires and radiator work done before the winter. but we do not have the funds. In addition, our computer just completely died and we will need a new one. In addition, the washing machine in our house started overfilling and leaking out and the sensor is not fixable. We thought we would need a new one, but just to remind us that He is still able, God provided that the same night we discovered the problem. A young family in our church here has a machine they are not using and will lend it to us. We are convinced God will also provide the other things we need.

The work in Hong Kong continues to go well. The ten men who come to take turns to preach

while we are on furlough have all been faithful and done well. Our co-workers, Linda and Ares, are doing well at keeping the evangelism going. Seven children were saved this summer. The Bible club is still growing and the teen club is continuing as it was. In October there was a special seminar for the families of our church and center on family relationships taught by Dr. Carson Fremont, a retired missionary from HK. Pray especially for Donny, who is the male leader in our church services now. He is doing well, but it is hard on him. He works very long hours.

Please continue to pray also about our need for a second car. Soon Roger will need to start traveling alone and the family will need to keep the Suburban here in NY. Pray that God will provide someone to lend us a small, gas-efficient car, or provide a way for us to get one.




