Chapter Seventeen

In Light Of The Presentation

2 Corinthians 11:1-4

Introduction

In a visit to Queen Elizabeth II of Great Britain, Michelle Obama made big news by touching the Queen. Mrs. Obama presumptuously put her arm around the Sovereign's shoulder. Some called it a gesture of warm affection while others declared it to be a violation of regal protocol. One British commentator said, "In monarchies, there is sacredness that surrounds the person that is perhaps not known in republics."

What surrounds the person of an earthly sovereign may be debatable among men, but without controversy, there is a sacredness that surrounds the person of God, and there is a divine protocol required when one comes into His presence. It is true that as believers in Jesus Christ we have direct access to God. We have boldness to enter into the holiest by the blood of Jesus (Hebrews 10:19). But that does not mean we may treat this privilege casually.

At the rapture/resurrection event, there will be a protocol in keeping with the honor and dignity of the Most High God. In 2 Corinthians chapter 11, the apostle Paul referred to a presentation he would make of those saints to Christ. The idea of a presentation of saints being made to Christ is also mentioned elsewhere in the New Testament. The word "presentation" refers to a bringing into the presence of, to be shown to, to be offered to, to be given to, to be placed at one's disposal. The language of Scripture thus suggests that such a formal presentation will be involved in our meeting with Christ upon this wonderful rapturous event.

A Series Of Presentations

Scripture indicates that a series of presentations will occur in the presence of Christ:

1. Men will present other men to Christ.

2 Corinthians 11:2

...that I may present you as a chaste virgin to Christ.

Colossians 1:28

...that we may present every man perfect in Christ Jesus.

2. Christ will present the church to Himself.

Ephesians 5:27

...that He may present it [the church] to Himself a glorious church....

3. Christ will present believers to the Father.

Colossians 1:21-22

And you, that were sometime alienated and enemies in your mind by wicked works, yet now hath he reconciled in the body of his flesh through death, to present you holy and unblameable and unreproveable in his sight....

Jude 1:24

Now to Him that is able to keep you from falling, and to present you faultless before the presence of His glory with exceeding joy....

4. The Father will present us to Himself.

2 Corinthians 4:14

Knowing that He which raised up the Lord Jesus shall raise up us also by Jesus, and shall present us with you.

The Presentation As a Chaste Virgin

1. The Godly Jealousy of a Spiritual Mentor

Paul expressed the godly jealousy of a spiritual mentor when he wrote to the church at Corinth. He said in 2 Corinthians 11:2, For I am jealous over you with godly jealousy. The word jealous is related to the word zealous. To have a godly jealousy is to be zealous in the pursuit of a good thing, to desire something earnestly, to exert oneself for another that he may not be torn away from the truth. This was the nature of Paul's passion for the Christians at Corinth.

He had made a considerable investment in their lives. He said (verse 2), For I have espoused you to one husband. The word espoused was used of carpenters fastening beams and planks together in the building of a house. To be espoused meant there had

been a permanent connection made between the pieces of wood in the structure of the house. The word then was transferred to the concept of marriage and referred to a permanent connection made between two individuals that had been pledged to each other to be Biblical espousing corresponds to the married. present day engagement to be married, but the Biblical version is very different from the present day version. Present day engagements may be easily broken simply by one of the parties declaring that it is dissolved. But in Bible times, the seal of an espousal was no different from the seal of a marriage covenant. It is in this sense that the church has been espoused to Christ. A divine seal has been placed upon this relationship (Ephesians 1:13-14 and 4:30), which makes it permanent and indissoluble.

Those who have been instrumental in bringing folks into this espoused relationship with Christ have a sense of responsibility for the enhancement of that relationship while we are waiting here on this earth. Hebrews 13:17 tells us about those that watch for our souls, as they that must give account [future tense verb], suggesting that such an account will be given in a presentation to Christ.

There is also the hope of fruit from nurturing such a relationship of this espousal to Christ. In 1 Thessalonians 2:19, Paul said, For what is our hope, or joy, or crown of rejoicing? Are not even ye in the presence of our Lord Jesus Christ at His coming? So Paul expected that when he and the Thessalonican believers stood in the presence of Christ, he would experience a sensation of rejoicing to see their reception by the Savior.

2. The Chaste Virginity of the Church

His godly jealousy toward his spiritual children, and his hope of rejoicing in the presence of Christ was rooted in Paul's desire to present the church as a chaste virgin to Christ. The word chaste indicates purity, something that is not stained, soiled, tarnished, or disgraced. The term virgin is used of either a man or a woman and also describes a condition of purity in which a person has been untouched by another. For the church to be a chaste virgin means that its purity is of such completeness that the church is spiritually untouched by some defiling agent.

3. The Potential Defiling Agents

Paul then describes for us the potential defiling agents that may spoil the chaste virgin status of the

church. In 2 Corinthians 11:3 he says, But I fear, lest by any means, as the serpent beguiled Eve through his subtilty, so your minds should be corrupted from the simplicity that is in Christ. The serpent, he says may be the perpetrator of the spoiling of the church by the following means.

He may beguile a Christian as he beguiled Eve in the beginning, misleading the mind, causing one to come to a conclusion based on a false representation. He said to Eve, "this fruit is perfectly safe to eat" when in fact it was not. Believers may be beguiled today to think that it is perfectly safe to indulge in certain things in this world when in fact those very things may have deadly consequences.

He may spoil a believer with subtilty, the playing of tricks. As a practical joke, some have used an ice cream scoop and dished up a bowl of butter. It may look exactly like ice cream and in appearance it may fool most who look at it. It is only after you partake that you find out it is not what it appears to be but then it is too late. The butter is already in your mouth. And if the butter is rancid, it is even worse. This is the kind of trickery the Devil likes to play on believers in spiritual activities.

He will attack the mind and seek to corrupt it. The mind here refers to mental perception, or the way we think about things. The word "corrupted" is an ethical term, referring to something unclean being put into something clean and thus defiling it. For example, a child may roll around in the mud and then change into clean clothes without taking a bath. His dirty body will defile the clean clothes. For the way we think about things to be corrupted means that the Devil will take pleasure in causing purified minds to think about things that are unclean. When the bad thoughts are put into good minds, the result will be a Christian who has a hard time keeping his mind on the things of the Lord.

He will seek to destroy the simplicity we have in Christ. The term "simplicity" means something that is free from hypocrisy. It is single in its focus and contains nothing contradictory. Through beguiling, subtilty, and the corrupting of our minds, the Devil works very hard at destroying our simplicity in Christ in order to make as many hypocrites as possible, for he delights in the destruction that is caused to Christ's reputation here on earth through the lives of hypocritical believers.

4. The Nature of the Defilement

In 2 Corinthians 11:4, the apostle Paul explains the nature of the defilement that results when the Serpent's beguiling works. He says that it results in the corruption of the doctrine of the church: For if he that cometh preacheth another Jesus, whom we have not preached, or if ye receive another spirit, which ye have not received, or another gospel, which ye have not accepted, ye might well bear with him.

The corruption of doctrine serves the Devil's purposes in blinding the minds of unsaved people to the light of the glorious gospel (2 Corinthians 4:1-4). If the church buys into another Jesus, another Spirit, and another gospel, then it will preach things that are not true and cannot save.

Unfortunately, we see too much evidence in the church today that the Devil has been successful. Consider this other gospel preached by Robert Schuler.

"To be born again means that we must be changed from a negative to a positive self image.... Sin is any act or thought that robs myself or another human being of his or her self-esteem. And what is hell? It is the loss of pride that naturally follows separation from God - the ultimate and unfailing source of our soul's sense of self-respect. 'My God, my God, why has thou forsaken me?' was Christ's encounter with hell. In that 'hellish' death our Lord experienced the ultimate horror - humiliation, shame, loss of pride as a human being. A person is in hell when he has lost his selfesteem.... The cross sanctifies the ego trip. For the cross protected our Lord's perfect selfesteem from turning into sinful pride.... Christ is the ideal One, for he was self-esteem incarnate.... Jesus never called a person a sinner....Rather he reserved his righteous rebuke for those who used their religious authority to generate guilt and caused people to lose their ability to taste and enjoy their right to dignity.... I have no right to ever preach a sermon or write an article that would offend the self-respect and violate the self-dignity of a listener or reader. Any minister, religious leader, writer, or reporter who stoops to a style, a strategy, a substance, or a spirit that fails to show respect for his or her audience is committing an insulting sin. Every human being must be treated with respect; selfesteem is his sacred right.... I don't think anything has been done in the name of Christ and under the banner of Christianity that has proven more destructive to human personality and, hence, counterproductive to the evangelism enterprise than the often crude, uncouth, and unchristian strategy of attempting to make people aware of their lost and sinful condition."

A simple response to this is what Scripture says: For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God (Romans 3:23) and For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life though Jesus Christ our Lord (Romans 6:23). Yet how many people have been denied the gift of God by the other gospel preached by such beguiled men as Robert Schuler?.

Or consider the other Jesus portrayed in the prayer of Rick Warren. Mr. Warren was selected to pray at the inauguration of Barak Obama. Here is the conclusion of that prayer:" I humbly ask this in the name of the one who changed my life - Yeshua, Isa, Jesus." His intention was to be inclusive and he fulfilled his purpose. But in the process, Mr Warren equated Jesus with the false god of Islam. Yeshua is the Old Testament equivalent of name Jesus. There was no harm there. But Isa is the Islamic name for Jesus. Islam teaches that Isa (Jesus) was a created human being, a prophet of Mohammed. If Isa is the one who changed Rick Warren's life, that may explain why he is so beguiled about the gospel. In leading people in a conversion prayer, Mr. Warren suggested the following: "Dear God, I want to know your purpose for my life. I don't want to base the rest of my life on wrong things. I want to take the first step in preparing for eternity by getting to know you. Jesus Christ, I don't understand how, but as much as I know how I want to open up my life to you. Make yourself real to me. And use this [teaching] in my life to help know what you made me for." After leading people to pray this prayer, Mr Warren announced, "Now if you've just prayed that prayer for the very first time I want to congratulate you. You've just become a part of the family of God."

The gospel according to Rick Warren does not include sin, the cross, the blood, or the death and sacrifice of Jesus Christ. It does not include repentance or faith or belief in the resurrection. It only involves some mushy submission to a yet unknown purpose God has for one's life. Literally tens of thousands of people or more have been subtly corrupted with this false gospel.

One more example of a beguiled preacher is Brian McLaren, a proponent of the emergent church movement. Here is his idea of the gospel.

> "I don't think we've got the gospel right yet. What does it mean to be 'saved'?....I don't think the liberals have it right. But I don't think we have it right either. None of us has arrived at orthodoxy.... Tony [Campolo] and I might disagree on the details, but I think we are both trying to find an alternative to both traditional Universalism and the narrow, exclusive understanding of hell [that unless you explicitly accept and follow Jesus, you are excluded from eternal life with God and destined for hell]..... What if Jesus' secret message reveals a secret plan?....What if he didn't come to start a new religion - but rather came to start a political, social, religious, artistic, economic, intellectual, and spiritual revolution that would give birth to a new world?.... The church's fixation on the death of Jesus as the universal saving act must end, and the place of the cross must be re-imagined in Christian faith. Why? Because of the cult of suffering and the vindictive God behind it Instead of being God's big message of saving love for the whole world, the gospel became a little bit of secret information on how to solve the pesky legal problem of original sin. I must add, though, that I don't believe making disciples must equal making adherents to the Christian religion. It may be advisable in many circumstances to help people become followers of Jesus and remain within their Buddhist, Hindu, or Jewish contexts."

The Bible tells us something entirely different from this.

Acts 4:12

Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved.

John 1:12

But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name.

1 Corinthians 12:13

For by one Spirit are we all baptized into one body whether we be Jews or Gentiles, whether we be bond or free: and have been all made to drink into one Spirit.

1 Thessalonians 1:9

For they themselves shew of us what manner of entering in we had unto you, and how ye turned to God from idols to serve the living and true God.

1 Peter 2:21

For even hereunto were ye called: because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that ye should follow his steps.

The Bible gives no secret message. Its message is very clear and plain. Jesus Christ is the only person whose name is able to render us saved. When we believe on his name and receive Him as our Savior, we are given authority to become a child of God. Everyone who receives Jesus as Savior is put into one spiritual body which means anyone who is in Christ has turned from any other religious persuasion they previously had followed. And the life of a follower of Christ includes sacrifice and the accompanying suffering of those sacrifices which serves to demonstrate the love of Christ to a lost world. To preach anything else, such as what Mr. McLaren suggests, is another gospel and subtly corrupts those who hear it.

If the church is going to be a chaste virgin in Christ, it must purify itself from all of the corruption of unsound doctrine. As God magnifies His Word above His Name (Psalm 138:2), we too must reverence the purity of what God has said as much as we reverence the Person of God Himself.

5. The Substance of Chaste Virginity in Christ

Sound doctrine, therefore, becomes the substance of our chaste virginity in Christ. We are implored in 2 Timothy 1:13-14 to hold fast the form of sound words, which thou hast heard of me, in faith and love which is in Christ Jesus. That good thing which was committed unto thee keep by the Holy Ghost which dwelleth in us. Other Scriptures also encourage us in the same thing.

Philippians 1:27

Only let your conversation be as it becometh the gospel of Christ: that whether I come and see you, or else be absent, I may hear of your affairs, that ye stand fast in one spirit, with one mind striving together for the faith of the gospel.

1 Thessalonians 5:21

Prove all things; hold fast that which is good.

Titus 1:9

Holding fast the faithful word as he hath been taught, that he may be able by sound doctrine both to exhort and to convince the gainsayers.

Revelation 22:18-19

For I testify unto every man that heareth the words of the prophecy of this book, If any man shall add unto these things, God shall add unto him the plagues that are written in this book: And if any man shall take away from the words of the book of this prophecy, God shall take away his part out of the book of life, and out of the holy city, and from the things which are written in this book.

1 Timothy 3:16 tells us that the mystery of godliness is without controversy. It says that *God was manifest in the flesh, justified in the Spirit, seen of angels, preached unto the Gentiles, believed on in the world, received up into glory.* There is no controversy about this. It is to be believed by everyone.

John 3:16 emphatically declares the heart of the gospel. For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life. The verses following this in the context make it very clear that there is no alternative to believing in Jesus Christ to be saved from perishing for eternity.

Verses in the book of Romans blaze a clear and simple path to salvation in Jesus Christ.

Romans 3:23

For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God.

Romans 5:8

But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.

Romans 6:23

For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Romans 10:9 and 13

That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved. For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation. For the scripture saith, Whosoever believeth on him shall not be ashamed. For there is no difference between the Jew and the Greek: for the same Lord over all is rich unto all that call upon him. For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved.

1 Peter 1:18-19 unequivocally describes the means by which mankind is redeemed from his lost estate. Forasmuch as ye know that ye were not redeemed with corruptible things, as silver and gold, from your vain conversation received by tradition from your fathers; But with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot.

Philippians 2:10-11 makes a profound declaration about the preeminence of Jesus Christ which He enjoys alone and shares with no other. That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth; And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.


Conclusion

(Sending Christian Materials Overseas)

We sent two cartons to the Philippines, two to Nigeria, two to Ghana, and two to South Africa through USPS. Seven large boxes (167 pounds) will be sent to Zambia through International Partnership Ministries. One box was taken by a missionary working in England. 
